### Admission Criteria: Medical Assistant, CTS

The Medical Assistant program prepares students for employment in private and large group physician's offices, clinics, hospitals, medical records, laboratories, and/or insurance companies. Upon completion of this competency-based program, students are eligible to take the national Certified Clinical Medical Assistant (CCMA) exam from the National Healthcareer Association.

The following requirements must be met for admission into the Medical Assistant program:

1. Students must be admitted to Baton Rouge Community College with eligibility to enroll in technical courses.
2. Applicants must have a high school diploma from a regionally accredited institution or a General Educational Development (GED) diploma.
3. Applicants must obtain the following test scores:

Applicants must pass a criminal background check and drug screening, obtain Basic Life Support for Healthcare Providers Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) certification from the American Heart Association, and other health requirements stipulated by the Division of Nursing and Allied Health or the clinical sites.
